The event will be noteworthy this year because we are celebrating 50 years of CMW and convenor Tania Granata has a few special things planned. Do mark your

calendars for November 21 at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Orleans to hear our students perform music by Canadian composers.

Tania has also volunteered to compile the information that comes in from our fee survey project as outlined in the October ORBit. There has been some response to date but we haven't heard from all of you yet. So please take a few minutes to send her your location, education, experience and fees. Names will be kept confidential, only the data collected will be shared. The point of it all is to help members determine a fair teaching fee.

In my October message I wrote about the benefits of being a member of ORMTA, specifically being part of a larger provincial/national group and the opportunities, strength and support that comes of it. This month I want to share some of the ideas under discussion that are above and beyond what is in our 2010-11 Calendar of Events. For openers, several provincial council members are working on a video project to produce videos of ORMTA workshops and have them available for viewing on ORMTA's website and YouTube. At the local level, we are discussing how to best use our budgeted advertising dollars and increase our web presence with things like Google Ads. We are also reviewing our scholarship policies to establish the most effective and respectful way to honour memorial donations.

These new directions will be presented at the General Meeting in January, so be sure to come to add your voice to the discussion. As a matter of fact, it was at the 2010 AGM that Colin Mack presented us with the idea of Google Ads - thank you Colin! Watch future ORBits to keep up-to-date on these important issues.

One of the highlights of our Fall season is the Provincial Young Artist recital. Convenor Susan Blyth-Schofield has organized Saturday evening October 30 at Freiman Hall to host Lesley Bouza, a young Toronto singer with tremendous talent and a wonderful stage presence. Her pianist Joy Lee is equally impressive. The Ottawa performance is part of an eight-city tour and from reports so far is a "must-attend".

The Ottawa Region Branch is indeed a busy one. It's all about teachers and students and what we can do to increase their experience with and enjoyment of music. Together we can make it better.

Unlock the Keys to Teaching the New Children: Strategies for Interacting and Teaching Today's Creative Children

Ottawa Region Branch was pleased to host this workshop on October 1 at the Ottawa Mennonite Church.

Over the last ten to fifteen years, have you noticed that your students are different? Many are overscheduled and come to us with poor reading skills, a dislike of repetition, and poor concentration. Yet these students are highly creative and enjoy making music.

Today's students have been stimulated by modern technological advances and affected by shifts in education and parenting philosophies. They store infor-

mation in pictures and love to verbalize. They enjoy doing several things at once: reading the paper, checking e-mail, eating, and surfing the internet. They prefer to master larger concepts first. In short, they are right-brain visual learners. Conversely, music teachers are often left-brain or whole-brain thinkers.

Through the use of video from his own studio, Derek showed how we can structure the learning environment and our teaching techniques to take advantage of these students' unique abilities without discouraging them. When we engage our students' passion, they can learn with their whole brain.

All in all, it was an enjoyable and informative morning.

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Passing the Torch

Teachers take great pleasure when a student chooses music as their life's career. But some amongst us have the added delight of their own children following in their footsteps. This is the first in a series of articles allowing us a glimpse into these special relationships.

Iain and Margaret Macpherson

The Macphersons are a musical family. All five members play at least one instrument but with the understanding that the piano is Margaret's. In fact, Iain says there was ALWAYS music happening in his home and to this day the family plays in ensembles "regardless of the mood at the moment".

Both Margaret and Iain began teaching in their teens with Margaret saying there was a demand and she "just kept going" and Iain saying he just "fell into it" as music appeared to be the only thing he was able to comprehend in life at that time. To date they have taught a total of 59 years. Both mention the opportunities for learning and sharing with musical colleagues as benefits of their membership in ORMTA. Margaret states that her students have participated in all the events offered.

Over her years of teaching, Margaret has noticed that students now have more distractions in their lives and that parents with high expectations often require enlightening as to what is required to be successful.

It is obvious that Margaret and Iain have mutual respect with both attributing a lot to the other in their development as teachers. Iain says his mother has and is helping with all aspects of setting up his studio and giving advice on his most challenging students. Margaret, on the other hand, says all three of her children provided a "case study" on how to approach students as individuals and that they kept her "current". Margaret was always concerned about encouraging her children musically without pushing them.

Margaret shared two very touching stories which occurred during her recent sojourn in Bermuda.



One of the highlights of her teaching involved an over age 70 Grade 4 piano student whose passionate goal was to achieve her Grade 5 level. Despite being an accomplished singer and actress, she had many disabilities with regards to piano. It took three years of painstaking patience but they did it! Bravo to both! The other story involved a solo performance of Iain in two oratorios with his parents playing in the Bermuda Symphony Orchestra. To my mind it does not get better than that.

One other thing: Iain and Margaret have a lot of fun together and maybe there is a lesson there.

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
