A Piano Tuner's Day: The Sostenuto Pedal

I received a call to tune my customer's pianos. She was a teacher and a regular customer. The small apartment piano always needed two tunings - just the way of small pianos. The grand, however, was usually fairly close to A440 and not a problem.

As I was finishing the tuning, she mentioned that the sostenuto pedal seemed to not be working well. (She was teaching Claire de Lune). I solved the problem and played the piano to check that everything was A-OK. I put the piano back together and left to wash my hands.

As I returned, she commented that the pedal was still not working. Slightly exasperated, I entered the room and asked her to demonstrate what was bothering her. She proceeded, and I smiled inwardly to myself. She said "See, it doesn't work!" I asked her to try it again and it elicited the same response from her. "It doesn't work." I then asked her to look at her feet - she was using the LEFT pedal. She smiled sheepishly and swore me to secrecy – that I never reveal what happened.

Problem SOLVED.



Young Artist Tour

The Ottawa Region Branch is delighted to be hosting Anita Pari in concert as part of the 2011 ORMTA Young Artist Tour. The event will take place on Sunday October 16, 2011 at 3:00 pm in Freiman Hall at the University of Ottawa and will be followed by a small

reception. Admission is \$10, with concessions for students and seniors (\$5) and families (\$20).

Thirteen-year-old Anita Pari is very excited to have been selected as this year's ORMTA Provincial Young Artist. In 2009, Anita placed first at the Canadian Music Competition and at the ORMTA provincials (student instrumental).

In 2010 she completed, with distinction, the Performers' Diploma of the Royal Conservatory of Music, receiving a gold medal for maintaining the highest average mark in theory exams. This year, she placed third at the Virginia Waring International Piano Competition where she performed Shostakovich's F Major Concerto with orchestra. Most recently she participated in the Young Artist Program of the National Arts Centre as the only young pianist selected in the pre-college program and was invited twice to perform in Ottawa's classical music festival Music and Beyond. Anita studies piano with Andrew Tunis of the University of Ottawa.





NEWS FROM DR. MAYA BADIAN

- *Clowns for Piano* is included in the 2010 edition of RCM Examinations' Official Examination Papers, Analysis Exam





- 1. Workshop Title: Teaching HARMONY in accordance with the Theory Syllabus 2009 Edition
- 2. Workshop Title: Teaching COUNTERPOINT in accordance with the Theory Syllabus 2009 Edition
- 3. Workshop Title: Teaching ADVANCED HARMONY in accordance with the Theory Syllabus 2009 Edition
- 4. **Workshop Title**: Teaching **ANALYSIS** in accordance with the Theory Syllabus 2009 Edition. Listeners are required to prepare papers of interest for them.

A 20-minute *Question-Answer* session with the audience follows at the end of each workshop.

III.- Maya Badian has been included in the book "Begegnungen mit Musik unserer Zeit, Komponisten-Colloquium der Carl von Ossietzky Universitat Oldenburg 1996-2011" / "Meetings with Music of Our Times, Composers Colloquium of Carl von Ossietzky University Oldenburg 1996-2011", published by Pfau Verlag Editions in Germany. The 500-page book presents a brief biography, together with selections of works, personal quotations on the process of composing and an example of each composer's works. All of the over 100 composers around the world had been invited to present lectures at Carl von Ossietzky University in Oldenburg, Germany, between 1996 and 2011.

Professor Dr. Maya Badian is the only Canadian chosen to lecture at this important colloquium on contemporary music. She successfully lectured about Canadian Music from Sea to Sea on October 22, 2010. Following her visit there, she received an official letter from Professor Violeta Dinescu, stating: "Dr. Badian, You are an outstanding ambassador of the Canadian Music, as you promote other Canadian composers from the Atlantic to the Pacific Oceans, and not only your own compositions! This is a gesture of rare collegial generosity. Your paper helped us to have a better approach of the contemporary music in Canada. Moreover, the audience was thrilled by your contagious enthusiasm, passion, and friendly manner in which you conducted the evening."

Dr. Badian's professional travel in Germany was made possible with the assistance of a Travel Grant from the Canada Council for the Arts.

Also after listening to Maya Badian's compositions, at request, Maya sent all of her musical scores and musicological writings - a total of 100 published works - to the Music Library of Carl von Ossietzky University Oldenburg. Mr. Karl-Ernst Went, University Library of Oldenburg, Music Collection, expressed his gratitude in a letter: "*Great moment when such a big parcel is arriving! Thanks a lot - and my very best wishes for you!*"



Adult Students' Workshop, Master Class and Recital 2012

I am happy and pleased to announce that <u>Frances Mae Balodis</u>, MEd., ARCT, LCCN(H), LCNCM(H), RMT, MYCC, will be our Adult Students' Workshop and Master Class clinician for 2012. Frances is well known in the Ottawa music community and has made significant contributions as a private piano teacher, composer, examiner and adjudicator. Frances serves as the Chairman of the Board of *Music for Young Children*® which she founded in 1980. As a composer of childrens' piano and vocal music, Frances was Director of the young children's choir *Bullfrogs and Butterflies* since 1982.

As a Registered Music Teacher, Frances received the Hugheen Ferguson Distinguished Teacher award at the CFMTA Convention in Regina, Saskatchewan in July 2011. She

was also nominated and is a finalist for the Louis Applebaum Composer Award. A certified Neurolinguistic Programmer (NLP) and an Accredited DISC Training provider, as well as a teacher with over 50 years experience, Frances is a sought-after speaker at conferences and is a welcome workshop clinician. She delights in helping people of all ages and places to understand their learning styles and is Co-Founder and Partner of *Communication, Learning and yoU (CLU*TM).

In June of this year, Frances moved from her Kanata home and now resides in Ullswater, Muskoka, Ontario. We are fortunate to have her return to Ottawa to present an Interactive Workshop in which she will address the specific needs of the adult music student. The workshop entitled <u>"Adult Learning Strategies"</u> will deal with such issues as: memory aides and how to memorize; how to cope with performance anxiety; making the best of limited practise time, etc. Frances will also lead the Master Class which is open to adult Beginner to Advanced Level piano students.

LJMC RULES

Performers to the Opening and Highlights Concerts are based on invitation only, but anyone who meets the following basic requirements is welcome to perform at any of the other concerts:

- You must be no older than 25.
- You must be a member.
- You must audition. However, if you are in Conservatory grade 9 or higher, your teacher can arrange for you to perform by submitting a **fully completed form** to the Auditions Chairperson, Edith Orton (Tel: 613-224-3381) by mail: 22 Tower Road, Ottawa, ON, K2G 2E5, or by e-mail: edithorton@sympatico.ca **two weeks before** the concert in which you wish to perform. Senior students are asked to observe this deadline.



- You must bring an original copy of your music selection to the audition. Students with photocopied music will not be allowed to audition or perform.
- Your music selection must be comparable to Conservatory standards.
- Your music selections must conform to the following time limits:
 - Grade 7 & under: less than 3 minutes
 - Grade 8 and 9: less than 5 minutes
 - Grade 10 & ARCT: less than 8 minutes; students at grade 10 and ARCT level may apply to perform pieces between 8 to 12 minutes long. A maximum of two such applications will be accepted for each concert. If there are more than two applications, approvals will be made on a first-come first-serve and rotating basis.
- Music selections must be memorized, unless you are playing duets.

AUDITION PROCEDURE

Students who wish to perform are asked to audition at the end of the concert prior to the one in which they wish to perform. For example, auditions for the November 5th concert take place on October 15th, as outlined in the concert calendar. The procedure is as follows:

- Purchase a 2011-2012 membership if you don't have one.
- Take an audition number when you arrive at the concert.
- An audition form must be fully completed (including selection, composer, playing time, teacher's phone number, e-mail address and accompanist's name and number), and presented to the Auditions Secretary. Bring an original copy of your music selection to the audition. Photocopied music will not be accepted.
- Auditions are conducted in order of the numbers drawn.
- Teachers will be contacted within a few days of the audition.
