





First Master Class at Carleton University by Katarina Jovic, University Liaison

The first master class organized in cooperation with the School for Studies in Art and Culture: Music at Carleton University took place on Sunday, June 2. This was a piano master class led by Mauro Bertoli, associate performance professor and newly appointed artist-inresidence at Carleton University. This event would not have been possible without the generous assistance of James K. Wright, associate professor and supervisor of performance studies at Carleton's School of Music, who helped me schedule this master class and offered Studio A (soon to be completely renovated and renamed in memory of Patrick Cardy) on the 9th floor of the Loeb

Building for the occasion. Professor Wright was in attendance and extended a warm welcome to our audience of 21 appreciative attendees.

Here are some questions I asked Professor Bertoli to answer after the master class.

1. We heard four promising young students ranging from Grade 8 to Grade 10. They performed works by J.S. Bach, Chopin and Schumann. What would you highlight as their biggest strength? What would you advise them to continue working on?

"The strength of those students was their ability to offer a personal interpretation of their work, without focusing only on the notes.


My general suggestions during the master class were to give more importance to right fingerings, to offer a more detailed performance (phrasing, dynamics, rhythm), and to perform with the score if necessary."

Mauro added that performing a piece from memory was not necessary and was overrated. If the piece can be performed with more ease and expression with the music, then it should be performed that way. He encouraged students to consider taking the opportunity to perform using the score and said that there are more and more pianists who have the courage of their convictions and are going on stage with the score.

2. What is the most rewarding part of taking master classes, from your own experience?

"The most rewarding part, I think, is the possibility to learn as much as possible from musicians who have more experience, choosing the advice to keep and discarding the advice we don't think is helpful or maybe just doesn't fit our personality or performance style. I always came back home having learned something, even from the master classes I might not have enjoyed a lot. I think this is an important attitude. I consider all those little things as a part of a puzzle, and all the pieces I've put together have helped me to grow as a musician. Of course, here and there you might be lucky to find a clinician who helps you solve a big part of the puzzle in just one lesson or who gives you a real life lesson, not just a lesson in music! The only "problem"—or I should say the magic of music—is that this is a never-ending puzzle."

3. What is it that you have discovered for yourself from teaching master classes?

"Every time I teach I have to find a way to transfer my suggestions to the students in a way they can clearly understand. That's challenging, of course, for several reasons. The students have different personalities, preparation, repertoire, skills, etc. You must change the way you teach according to the person who is in front of you. It's like when you perform: you have to adapt your playing to the instrument, hall and acoustics you have. They don't change, but you can. Adaptability is the key.

In a master class that's more difficult because in a few minutes you have to clearly understand the person in front of you, not only as a musician but as a human being, and you have to deal with this person in front of an audience, which might add more stress to the situation. It's very important to establish the right relationship with the students, and I have learned that the psychological side is extremely important."

I wish to thank Professor Bertoli again for his kindness in offering his comments as well as for taking the time to thoroughly answer my questions. Our mutual desire is to foster this newly established relationship with Carleton University for years to come and to offer our members more of such valuable and unique experiences.






