On Friday, October 12th, our branch hosted Juliana Krajčovič in the Young Artist recital. Please turn to page 5 to read more.



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Information Sharing Session September 24th, 2018

The Information Sharing session took place as scheduled on Monday September 24th. Several teachers had tornado and severe weather stories to share, but fortunately all 19 teachers who attended had no direct damage to their homes.

The main focus of the morning session was two books by UK teacher Paul Harris - The *Virtuoso Teacher* and *Simultaneous Learning*. Paul Harris's approach emphasizes proactive teaching rather than the 'correcting of mistakes'. Paul Harris encourages teachers to teach from the ingredients in the music and to demonstrate the organic connection of musical elements. It encourages the by Paulette Price, Convenor

teacher to set up creative, musical activities that lead the student into real understanding and allows for a more natural musical response - ideally, before the music books are even opened! Paulette Price led teachers through an outline of the books and shared the challenges and fun she has had with the approach in her studio this fall. For those who weren't able to attend but might be interested in hearing Paul Harris's ideas, there is an hour-long video online where you can watch Paul Harris being interviewed by Tim Topham on the topic of Simultaneous Learning.

Alexandra Golod reported to us on the newly organized **Ot-**
