Vesuvioso – gradually build up to a fiery, explosive conclusion.

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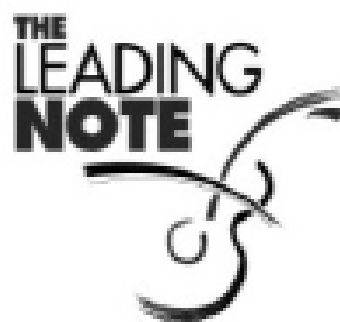

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## September Information Sharing Session

Twenty teachers gathered on the morning of September 25th for an Information Sharing session on the teaching of musicianship skills. It was a topic of real interest - questions were flying and challenges shared! Teachers agreed that the discussion could have gone on well into the afternoon.

A great variety of innovative ideas were offered regarding rhythmic elements. The benefits of different types of tapping, drumming and stomping were discussed as they were described and demonstrated. Interesting approaches such as "takadimi" and rhythm cup work (Wendy Stevens) were shared as new options for adding to the understanding and perception of beat and rhythm.

Pros and cons of online resources were discussed in detail. The undeniable value of singing and tonic sol-fa was reconfirmed.

The challenges presented by students who have a problem with a particular element were explored and helpful tips were suggested. Making the elements of aural training more relevant and embedded into the fabric of each lesson was a goal for many teachers.

Teachers agreed that creating an environment where mistakes are used as steps to growth, and creativity and exploration are enjoyed by student and teacher alike makes lessons productive and fun. The enthusiastic sharing of perspectives confirmed that there are many hard working teachers with great ideas among us!
