They can be found at https:// www.ontario.ca/laws/regulation/r20364 for stage 3. The "Teaching of Music" is specifically referenced in "In-person teaching and instruction" in section 5. To help you, the CFMTA has arranged for the law firm of Oakes to prepare a Waiver and Release. This can be found on the CFMTA website (https://www.cfmta.org). waiver is password-protected so if you need the password, follow the instructions at the bottom of their page. Please be aware that this waiver has not been tested in court. There is also now a COVID-19 button on our website with important links should you need the information. Above all. remember that we are all independent businesses and responsible for our choices and the consequences of our choices.

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Tech for Teaching with Dr. Juanita Marchand Knight

Covid? Processor? DAW? Jitsi? Teaching Online?

Music teaching as we knew it was turned upside down this spring. If you were like me, I was determined to offer my students their lessons virtually. I got out my computer and my old ipad mini and decided that I had to do this. And I did. And it worked! It worked well! I did notice though, there was room to improve.

Fast forward 6 months to a branch budget meeting where the idea of hosting a professional development session BEFORE our general meeting was suggested to help our teachers learn about different technology we could use while teaching online. We put on our planning hats and with the help of Susan Blyth-Schofield, Dr. Juanita Marchand Knight, a Music Technology researcher from McGill University, was scheduled to give our branch a "Tech for Teaching" Workshop on Zoom.

We discussed solutions and platforms for collaborative music-making in real-time.



At the end of the presentation, members typed questions into the chat box and Dr. Knight answered them.

There was a great turn-out from Ontario. 33 members from Ottawa, Hamilton and even Manitoba joined our zoom session.

Information Sharing Session Exploring Contemporary Piano Repertoire, presented by Colin Mack

The session took place on Zoom on September 24th and focussed on finding ways that composers have creatively applied 20th century composition techniques.

The emphasis of this presentation was the integration of composition techniques found in specific piano pieces. Not trying to give formula for composing, but rather carefully examining how different 20th Century theoretical techniques have been applied to create good music. This comes from the firm belief that composition should begin in the

imagination within, but analysis of good music can stimulate the process.

The presentation was useful for teachers wanting to encourage students to compose as well as help provide a deeper understanding of new repertoire to students. Most of the material in this presentation could be found in current RCM Piano Repertoire, Etude and Theory texts.

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The time that COVID-19 restrictions gave us over spring and summer prompted bursts of indoor activity for many of us. After cleaning out some household clutter I turned to the many ORMTA archive boxes tucked away in our basement. Now would be the time for a serious sort through reams of correspondence, newspaper clippings, photos, recital programs and minutes collected over the decades. Here are a few standouts.

ORMTA's roots go back to 1885 with the formation of the Ontario Music Teachers Association, which evolved into the Canadian Society of Musicians, a large, varied, and successful group that came to an unexpected end in 1896. ORMTA as a group was formed in Toronto in 1936 by a group of music teacher associations, with Ottawa becoming a branch member in 1938. In the early years ORMTA membership dues went to Treasurer Cora Ahrens in Stratford, our dues now go to Nancy Dale in Niagara-on-the-Lake. I love that theatre connection.

At the 1956 ORMTA Silver conference held in Ottawa at the Chateau Laurier the program listed the names of just over 100 member teachers with addresses ranging from Perth to Cornwall. Although most were Piano there were 7 who taught organ as well, 5 violin, 14 voice, 1 brass, 1 eurhythmics, and 3 SCH, presumably school. The Opening Evening program showcased eurhythmics students of Brenda Beament. Other evening recitals featured pianist Joan Milliken and singer Jack Cook.

In 1966 then President Sister Marie Claire invited ORMTA members to join RCM Alumni to entertain June RCM Examiners at the Green Valley Restaurant on the Prescott Highway. Price for the meal \$3.30.

In 1974 ORMTA Ottawa took on Ottawa City Bylaws when they pushed back against a complaint about teachers working from home studios. After a long, complicated and expensive process ORMTA won. This success could never have happened without a concerted group effort.

An October 1976 document outlines a program presented by RCM Representative W.J. (Bill) Marsh on the terms of reference "to organize and administer the theoretical and practical examinations of the RCM at the Ottawa centre".

In 1979 the Young Artist Competition and recital tour came to Ontario under the joint sponsorship of ORMTA and CFMTA. Programs and posters are part of the archive material. If you want to know who was YA and when just ask. Not sure I want to deposit that file just yet.

Most but not all of the files are about ORMTA. In February 1986 the Laurentian Junior Music Club under its President Elsie Melson was welcomed into membership of the Ottawa Region Music Council.

Many interesting hours have been spent so far and there are more ahead, I am presently only into the 1990's. When Ottawa City Archives are open again there will be several boxes ready for deposit. Some files will be harder to part with than others.
