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Congratulations Dr. Gilles Comeau! Recipient of the ORMTA Contribution to Teaching Award

Gilles Comeau was born and raised in Hearst, Ontario. His first music teachers were nuns from the Order of Sisters of the Assumption, all of them ORMTA members. The nearby town of Timmins was a popular destination for ORMTA student workshops. After a summer course at RCM on the Kelly Kirby Kindergarten Piano Method with then 92-year-old May Kelly Kirby, the teenaged Gilles placed an ad for students in his local paper. Forty-five students responded and a career path was launched.

Teaching had to be set aside for the university years. Dr. Comeau's Master's thesis was the basis for the 1995 publication *Comparing Dalcroze, Orff and Kodaly; choosing your approach to teaching music,* of which copies still sell in the original English and French versions as well as the recent Chinese translation. Regular travel to l'Université de Montréal for PhD and post doctoral studies in piano pedagogy with Gilles Manny and Marc Durand followed, preparation for setting up what became a highly successful private studio in the city.

It was at this time that Ottawa Region Branch President Brenda Eisener invited the newly minted PhD to join ORMTA's Executive Committee. One of his most satisfying recollections is establishing the University of Ottawa/ ORMTA master class event, a liaison that for the past ten years has university professors volunteer their expertise to advanced students of local teachers.

Between 1995 and 2005 Dr. Comeau operated *Studea Musica*, a venture designed to bring to the younger student a deeper awareness of Canadian music and Canadian composers. A summer highlight was a week-long camp in the beautiful pastoral setting of Orford, offering training in Dalcroze, piano, strings and pedagogy, some of which could

be taken for university credit. At home, *Studea Musica* published compositions for younger students by Canadian composers, notably Ann Southam and Mary Gardiner. So they could listen to this new music, eminent Ottawa pianist and Carleton University professor Dr. Elaine Keillor performed over 250 such pieces on a *Studea Musica* produced CD.

Since 2001 Dr. Comeau has served as Professor and Director of the world-class University of Ottawa Piano Pedagogy Research Laboratory. Despite the demands of academic life, he continues to be open to and supportive of Ottawa's music teaching community. Ottawa Region Branch is delighted to acknowledge his unique and invaluable contribution to teaching with this award.

Please Note: The ORMTA Contribution to Teaching Award (OCTA) is the new name for the Special Teacher Award.

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



University of Ottawa Piano Master Class Series

The first master class of the season took place on Sunday, January 27, with Professor Andrew Tunis at Freiman Hall, School of Music, University of Ottawa. As the newly appointed University Liaison, I started searching for some background and historical data on the event. I was amazed to discover that this tradition between the School of Music and ORMTA goes back to 2002. One of the first teachers who agreed to share his expertise and knowledge was Professor Andrew Tunis.

The program consisted of works by Bach, Beethoven, Debussy and Mozart presented by Grades 9 and 10 and Associate-level students. All five of them performed with great confidence and showed a high level of understanding of score and style. Andrew Tunis was very gracious and delicate in offering his valuable comments and ideas to the students. This event was well attended, with a number of ORMTA teachers in the audience of thirty-six appreciative people.

Mr. Tunis's experience and musicianship remain great assets to our piano community. He continues to be an inspiring, knowledgeable and supportive teacher and we thank him for that. I can personally attest to his skills as an educator as I had the pleasure of studying with Professor Tunis at the University of Ottawa 11 years ago.

The next master class, with David Jalbert, took place on Sunday, March 17, from 1 to 4 pm at the University of Ottawa. This master class consisted of Grade 10 and Associate students performing works by Bach, Chopin, Debussy and Prokofiev.



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


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Angela Hewitt Master Class

The day after Angela Hewitt's performance of Bach and Debussy at Ottawa's National Arts Centre, Ottawa Citizen reporter Richard Todd was busy typing up a striking commendation, "Hewitt has been called the greatest Bach pianist of our time, and listening to her Tuesday its hard not to agree. She may even be the greatest of all time." While Todd was writing these powerful words, ORMTA Ottawa Region Branch, together with University of Ottawa School of Music, was hosting Angela Hewitt in a master class on the keyboard music of J. S. Bach.

Hewitt's place as an authority on the music of Bach comes from her extensive career as a performer of Bach's concertos, suites, and preludes and fugues as well as her lecture-recital DVD, "Bach Performance on the Piano" which was released in 2009 by Hyperion to great acclaim worldwide.

Hewitt gave general guidelines for teachers and students as well as specific ideas for individual interpretation. Combining useful hints with witty anecdotes and reminiscenses, she gave advice on fingering, phrasing, articulation, ornamentation, voicing, tempo, pedalling, touch and tone.

This opportunity for university piano majors and students of local ORMTA teachers to play for Ms. Hewitt was a unique experience. One performer later described it as a "truly memorable opportunity. I am so thankful to have been a part

of it." Ms. Hewitt also commented on her blog, "it was nice to hear the young kids only play Bach for me."

ORMTA would like to thank the University of Ottawa for their co-sponsorship of the event, Ryan Hum, Samuel Lee, Andréa Tremblay, and Alice Liu for playing, for all the University and ORMTA teachers who submitted applications for their students, and for the immense efforts of volunteers Ann Babin, Ann Empey, Tania Granata, Debra Grass, Betty Harris, Sue Jones, Sandra Menard and Kimberley Sundell. Thanks also to everyone who attended this event.

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

We run an ad on Google Adwords, which is a pay-perclick ad that appears along-side search results. The budget for this campaign is \$3/day, and we only pay when someone clicks on the ad to visit our website. On average, our ad appears over 250,000 times in one year, and results in over 1200 visits to our website.

There is a link to our website on the website of Ottawa Parenting Times Magazine. This was included with an ad we purchased from them in September.

Several times a year, we place an ad in Capital Parent magazine.

We have a reciprocal advertising agreement with Orpheus Musical Theatre Society. They get a full-page ad in the ORBit in exchange for a business-card-sized ad in each of their programs (they produce three musical theatre shows each season).
