Piano Master Classes 2017-18

ORMTA student master classes are designed to provide a learning experience for both teachers and students. Performers and audiences benefit from the insights and advice that each professor has to offer. We are grateful for the space that

the University of Ottawa provides and for the time and talent freely given by

the professors.

This academic year we held two piano master classes in cooperation with the School of Music, University of Ottawa. The first was held on November 19 with Professor David Jalbert, and the clinician for the second on January 14, 2018 was newly appointed part-time piano Professor Leopoldo Erice. Students had a chance to play on the brand new 9-foot Yamaha piano.

The master classes provided excellent opportunities for our students to perform and receive interesting and constructive feedback. Both are highly praised musicians and performers, and experienced teachers, and each offered different views on aspects of the art of piano performance. Professor Erice reminded all performers of the importance of posture. Professor Jalbert focused on technique and how to make improvements in particular areas. Professor Erice compared different voices with orchestral instruments while Professor Jalbert evoked the historical background of piec-





es, composers and their style or country of origin. Both were looking for that ideal sound and phrasing. While David Jalbert spoke with his recognizable charisma and delicate sense of humor, Leopoldo Erice was observing the performer from all angles of the room, often suggesting simple and logical treatments of a certain character, mood or harmony. Master class repertoire included Beethoven's Sonatas op. 26, 53 and 110, Chopin's Scherzo no.2, selected Sonatas by Mozart, Scarlatti and Berg as well as shorter pieces by Grieg and Poulenc.

I sincerely hope that each performer felt they were given practical suggestions for improvement and that they were provided with a fresh view on their piece, inspiring them to bring it to another level and ready to shine at the next recital or competition. I believe the memories, the magic, and the constructive commentary from these events will stay with them for many musical years to come.

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

Information Sharing for February 26, 2018

Location: home of Paulette Price, 13 Lismer Crescent, Kanata, from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Kathleen Prochnau will present ideas from a book by Rebecca Payne Shockley titled: Mapping Music: For Faster Learning and Secure Memory (A Guide for Piano Teachers and Students).

Mapping is helpful for beginning a new piece, finishing one that is partly memorized, or relearning old repertoire. Teachers will find mapping helpful not only as a memory aid, but as a tool for developing functional skills such as reading, improvising harmonization, and analysis.

The basic procedure is to study the score away from the instrument, jot a few notes on paper to help remember the main features, and then use this map to improvise and build a mental blueprint of the score. Kathleen will demonstrate how the process can work in early, intermediate, and advanced repertoire and finish with a chance for teachers to try out mapping for themselves.


