Information Sharing Session, November 9th

Nine members met for a lively discussion session to share ideas on how to help students to practice more effectively. One teacher described ways that she rewards practice achievements with a point chart that leads to small prizes. Another described her annual studio competition, where students work independently on a particular project (ear training, sight reading, etc) for a period of time until an outside teacher is brought in to judge their accomplishments. The prizes definitely spur on the practicing!

Teachers described how they search for new ways to talk with their students to encourage them to become more observant of what they see and hear. Many stressed that students could impress them sometimes, but finding the best way to inspire each student to practice well and think independently is a challenge. It was wonderful to see the care and thought that teachers put into their approach to suit each student's personality and stage of development. Some very intriguing parallels were shared, for instance, why is practicing piano like being a firefighter? What do volleyball hands have to do with technique?

Also discussed were ways of increasing awareness of the many types of work that students are doing when they practice – to become more aware of the roles that their mind can play, for instance the role of the poet, the mechanic, the project manager, the drill sergeant, the conductor, the inspector for detail. Learning to shift roles can increase focus and can help keep practicing fresh.

It was a pleasure to discuss this topic with such wise and creative colleagues!

Adult Students' Piano Workshop & Master Class

Robert Dvorkin will be our clinician for the 2016 Piano Workshop and Master Class, to be held on Saturday, February 27, 2016 at 9:30 at Ottawa Pianos, 1412 Bank Street.

Robert began piano lessons at the age of nine, and two years later was accepted in the studio of Ernesto Lejano of the University of Alberta, with whom he studied for the next six years. In 1974, Robert entered the Bachelor of Music program at Indiana University in the studio of György Sebők. Robert obtained a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance, studying with Enrica Cavallo-Gulli. He lived in New York City for many years, and performed and taught in both the United States and Canada. In 1999, he was inspired by the work of Dorothy Taubman and began an intensive study of her approach. His expertise in the Taubman Approach has benefited many students of all levels. He moved to Ottawa in 2014 where he maintains an active teaching studio. He continues to perform in many cities in the United States and Canada. The Piano Workshop will include the Taubman Approach, which is a codified set of technical principles that, when correctly applied, can result in a near-tension-free playing experience, and can lead the way to a virtuoso technique. Students who experience tension, awkwardness, and/or pain while playing report that the Approach vastly improves their ability to produce sound, play without pain, sight-read better, learn more quickly, and myriad other benefits.

The Workshop will be followed by a Master Class for six performers. Applicants will be chosen on a "first-come, firstserved" basis. Please submit your completed applications as soon as possible. Due to limited space in the Master Class, we are also offering a Practice Performance Evaluation for additional students who wish to play in the Recital on March 19, 2016 at City View United Church. The Practice Performance is a chance to play for peers and to receive comments and suggestions from Mr. Dvorkin.

The Twelve Days of Christmas

The best known English version was first printed in English in 1780 in a little book intended for children, *Mirth without Mischief*, as a Twelfth Night "memories-and-forfeits" game, in which a leader recited a verse, each of the players repeated the verse, the leader added another verse, and so on until one of the players made a mistake, with the player who erred having to pay a penalty, such as offering up a kiss or a sweet. In Scotland, early in the 19th century, the recitation began: "The king sent his lady on the first Yule day, I A popingo-aye [parrot]; I Wha learns my carol and carries it away?" The succeeding gifts were two partridges, three plovers, a goose that was grey, three starlings, three goldspinks, a bull that was brown, three ducks a-merry laying, three swans a-merry swimming, an Arabian baboon, three hinds a-merry hunting, three maids a-merry dancing, three stalks o' merry corn. -Wikipedia
